Channel Islands Condors Fire Mitigation Plan

The CI Condors will have the following equipment with them at all times. It will be required to have two qualified members (pilot and spotter) for every one model aircraft flying.

**Equipment:**

- An equipment bag will be kept within 50 feet per active pilot at all times and will consist of:
  - A water extinguisher, shovel and battery operated two-way radio will be bundled and equipped with a shoulder strap to make them easy to grab and take into the field without delay. The battery operated two-way radio is paired with another battery operated two-way radio so both members are able to communicate to each other.

Members not actively flying or working on an aircraft will act as spotters and be available to respond immediately when any other pilot indicates in-flight difficulties or in the event a model aircraft goes down and additional members are requested to assist.

If an aircraft goes down the spotter will grab the equipment bag and go to the crash site. Using the battery operated two-way radio; the spotter will notify the pilot if there is an emergency. If there is an emergency, the pilot will call 911 and/or use the onsite blue phone to contact University Police.

All parties will immediately call 911 and/or use the onsite blue phone if smoke is visible from a downed model aircraft, regardless of current progress with local incident response.

Emergency procedures will be provided to all members prior to flying. All members are responsible for understanding the agreement between the CI Condors and the University.

The airfield will be declared closed when red flag weather conditions have been declared for Eastern Ventura County or when sustained wind speed (as reported by Camarillo airport KCMA ATIS) exceeds 25 knots.

**Communication Plan:**

- A communication plan shall be coordinated with the University to ensure a line of communication exists between the CI Condors and the University at all times. If there is an emergency, the CI Condors will dial 911 and/or use the onsite blue phone which will contact the University Police when activated.

- As part of the communication plan, all onsite incidents will be reported to the University at the time of the incident.
